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LETTER FROM YOUR LEADERSHIP TEAM

DEAR TWO RIVERS 4TH STREET FAMILIES,

Welcome Back! We hope you are enjoying a wonderful summer and are feeling relaxed, recharged, and ready to start a new school year! Whether you are a new family or a family returning to Two Rivers, we welcome you and are excited that you are a part of our 4th Street Crew.

Our leadership team is excited to meet you soon! Our school principal, Dr. Danielle, has been in education for over 20 years and is entering her second year at Two Rivers. Our assistant principal of culture, Ms. Rachel, is entering her sixth year at Two Rivers and second year on the leadership team. In January of 2022, we welcomed a new campus director of special education, Mr. Ben, who is entering his eighth year in education in DC. The newest member to our team, Mr. Guye, will be our assistant principal of instruction. Mr. Guye is a familiar face to Two Rivers as one of the founding members of our school! He has held many roles in the education community, and we are excited to welcome him back to 4th Street as an assistant principal.

The Two Rivers Community is driven by the EL Education phrase - "We are crew, not passengers." Our team has been using this phrase to intentionally plan ways for students to enter our doors feeling a sense of belonging, excitement to begin the school year, and reassurance in returning to a community they know and love.

Arrival/Dismissal Logistical Update

Please review some best practices of our crew mindset arrival protocols:

The arrival window is from 8:15-8:30am. All students entering at 8:31 or after will be marked tardy. Upper School (US) students who arrive at the Lower School (LS) after 8:30am will need to be escorted by a parent/guardian across 4th Street to the US.

If your student needs assistance getting out of a car or you need to speak with a TR crew member, plan to park in the neighborhood or local garages so that you do not block the "kiss and ride" lane, which is to be used only for quick drop-offs.

All students will enter their building (Lower School or Upper School) through the front doors. Families may walk their students into the building and drop them off at their crews - a pre-pandemic practice that we are glad to restore!

Below are some best practices of our crew mindset dismissal protocols:

The dismissal window is from 3:15-3:30pm; all students must be picked up by 3:30pm.

Families will be able to enter the building and pick up their student(s) directly from their crew - a prepandemic practice that we are glad to restore!

Aftercare or afterschool partner programs will pick students up directly from their crew.

LETTER FROM YOUR LEADERSHIP TEAM

Families who would like to utilize the pick-up lane can do so by pulling up and providing their student's name to a TR staff member who will call the student down.

Students in 3G-5G are eligible to be independent walkers and pick up their siblings to meet their family at home or at a local meeting point. During enrollment, families were able to provide permission for this status. To update this status, email **4esattendance@tworiverspcs.org**.

Beautiful Spaces

In addition to using the mindset of we are crew, not passengers, our team will be guided by the EL Education Core Practice of <u>Creating Beautiful Spaces for Learning</u>. Towards the end of the 2021-22 school year, we were able to open our new Upper School rooftop recess space, a space designed by our students. We're also glad to be replacing the playground wrap around our Lower School playground this summer. Soon, you will see our walls filled with high-quality student work, freshly painted rooms and clean, organized spaces!

As we welcome you back into the building for arrival, dismissal, and other weekly events, you will be able to see learning come alive in classrooms and hallways.

Student Placement in Crews and Classrooms

A great deal of time, effort and thought has gone into the process of student placement for the upcoming school year. Teachers, counselors, and leaders took careful consideration to ensure your student is placed in a crew where they can feel a sense of belonging, excitement for the school year, and reassurance in being a part of a crew they know and love.

As COVID restrictions continue to lift, we will ease back to pre-pandemic practices. We have returned to our traditional two classes per grade in PK-3G. In PS, we will continue to keep three cohorts and in 4G-5G, classes will remain departmentalized. That means that in 4th and 5th grade students will have a crew leader whom they start their morning with for culture building and then they will travel between rooms for math or literacy. Additionally, our students will return to many of the Two Rivers traditions of being able to socialize across grade- and school-level classes during the school day. Traditionally, KG-1G, 2G-3G, and 4G-5G grade bands have followed a looping structure where student crews/teachers stay together for two years. Due to staffing changes, cohort restructuring, and departmentalization, the only grade band that will complete a traditional loop this year is the 21-22 KG crews. We hope to fully restore our looping structure in the future.

LETTER YOUR LEADERSHIP TEAM

More information will be forthcoming around your student's specific crew list as well as how traditional beginning-of-the-year potlucks and back-to-school conferences will look. Again, now that our health guidelines have opened up more, we will be returning to many successful past practices to foster community! In our end-of-year family survey we learned that hearing from your school leadership team regularly helps you stay informed and in touch. Please add 7/27 from 4:30-6pm to your calendars for our After-Care Fair at the Two Rivers Middle School Gym (830 26th St. NE), where you will be able to learn more about after school activities.

We will communicate additional information about welcome events via ParentSquare by the end of the month—and you can find regular updates from our leadership team in the "Principal's Corner" of the weekly Trib newsletter for families, which is delivered via ParentSquare and will be sent home every Tuesday. This Welcome Packet includes instructions on accessing ParentSquare. If you need additional assistance with ParentSquare, please reach out to Mr. Khizer (khusain@tworiverspcs.org).

Please know we are always here to help you and your student, so please don't hesitate to call, email or stop by. We are crew, not passengers!

Uniform Purchases

Student Dress at Two Rivers

Two Rivers' uniform policy is intended to generate a feeling of unity, while allowing students some personal choice. Students are required to wear a Two Rivers uniform top at all times while in school building. However, students may wear any bottoms they choose as long as they are appropriate in length and design. Please closely review the Student Dress section of the forthcoming Family Handbook for additional dress guidance, including details about dressing for weather, footwear, and loaner uniforms.

To purchase uniforms, families can visit Two Rivers uniform and lunch store online here starting on August 8. If you need financial support to purchase your child's uniforms, please email your assistant principal. Uniform pick-up will be at the Young Campus starting two weeks before the first day of school.

While you can access the uniform store website starting on August 8 to pre-order uniforms, please note that uniforms cannot be picked up until our physical uniform store re-opens two weeks prior to the start of school. Look for information via ParentSquare for updates. Finally, we expect a number of items to be restocked in mid-August, so don't worry if you find an item that you need is currently out of stock.



Immunizations and Medical Records

Don't Delay, Schedule Today! In order to prevent the spread of infectious diseases, it is vital that all students are fully immunized before returning to in-person learning. No Shots, No School is being enforced by the Department of Health (DOH), which means that students who do not have required immunization records submitted to the school will NOT be admitted to the building to attend school. All students must have an up-to-date immunization certification on file to attend in-person learning. Please note, proof of appointment will no longer be accepted.

We use these tools as part of our ongoing work to ensure every student is reaching both academic and developmental milestones and it helps us know a bit about your child before their year starts. You will likely want to print or review a PDF of the questionnaire on your devise before submitting the answers online because some questions ask about your child's response to very specific tasks that you might not have done with your child. Please use this link and click the option for BOTH ASQ-3 and ASQ-SE on the welcome screen. We ask that you complete these questionnaires by August 15th at the latest.

OPTIONAL FORMS

Meals at Two Rivers

Families can purchase meals at our <u>uniforms and meals</u> <u>online store</u>. We have a new meal vendor this year and they ask families complete a <u>Meal Preference Form</u> regarding dietary restrictions and meal program selection.



Breakfast at Two Rivers is free for all students and Two Rivers participates in the National School Lunch Program, which includes free and low cost options for lunch.

We ask that ALL families interested in having their child receive meals through school complete the <u>Free and Reduced Price Meal Application Form</u> to sign up AND additionally complete this <u>Meal Preference Form</u> regarding allergies and meal program selection. For families who previously have paid for meals and have a credit in their account, please stay tuned for more information on how that will impact payment for the current school year.

Permission to Administer Medication

If your child needs to take medication during the school day, please use <u>this form</u> to detail your student's medication and/or medical procedure plan to be administered at school and return it to the the school nurse or <u>medical@tworiverspcs.org</u>. The School Nurse will contact you to arrange medication/medical supply drop-off. For multiple needs, complete multiple sheets.

Parental Medicaid Consent Form

Special education students only.

If your child receives special education services please review and complete a <u>Parental Medicaid Consent Form</u> to ensure that Two Rivers can receive appropriate federal reimbursements for certain health related services provided pursuant to your child's IEP. The form can be turned in at your school's front desk. Examples of health related services for which Two Rivers may be reimbursed include the following:

- Audiology Services/Assessment
- Behavioral Support Services
- Nutrition
- Occupational Therapy/Assessment
- Speech-Language Pathology Services/Assessment
- Orientation and Mobility Assessment
- Physical Therapy Services Assessment
- Psychological Evaluation
- Skilled Nursing Services
- Special Education Transportation Services

Opt-out of COVID Testing

Families can opt-out of COVID "rapid" antigen nasal testing that Two Rivers may conduct onsite using this form. The school may test students if they exhibit COVID-like symptoms during the day, if they are close contacts as part of a "test to stay" regimen, or randomized asymptomatic testing. The school may also test students if their families did not submit a COVID test result after a long holiday as a "test to return" protocol. "Sixty-six percent (66%) of parents reported being burned out."



This staggering statistic was released this summer of 2022 in a study on "Parental Burnout" by Ohio State University. This means as much as two out of three parents or guardians in our own community may be returning to school in the Fall with feelings of "physical fatigue, emotional exhaustion, lack of motivation, a sense of despair, as well as a detachment from others and pleasurable activities."

The good news is the symptoms can be temporary. According to this Healthline.com article, ways to manage "parental burnout" include:

- Talking with your spouse, co-parent, or partner
- Getting enough sleep and exercise, and
- Building a support network
