LETTER FROM YOUR LEADERSHIP TEAM

DEAR 4TH STREET ELEMENTARY FAMILIES,

Greetings 4th Street Families!

I am so honored to re-introduce myself as your Principal and welcome you to Two Rivers 4th St Elementary for the 2024-2025 school year. I am grateful to those of you who have already spent time meeting with me, and I look forward to meeting all of our families as we collaborate on plans for the upcoming school year. As we embark on this journey together, it's important that I learn as much as I can about you and our scholars and share some of who I am and what drives me to do this work. Therefore, I'd like to share a little about my background and educational philosophy.

I am a native Washingtonian and product of the DC Public School System. In 2004, I was one of the founding staff for Two Rivers Public Charter School (PCS). LETTER FROM YOUR LEADERSHIP TEAM

Important Reminders

Student Placement in Crews and Classrooms:

A great deal of time, effort and thought has gone into the process of student placement for the upcoming school year. Teachers, counselors, and leaders took careful consideration to ensure your student is placed in a crew where they can feel a sense of belonging, excitement for the school year, and reassurance in being a part of a crew they know and love.

Arrival and Dismissal:

We need your partnership with timely arrival and dismissal. As you prepare for the new school year, we encourage your family to determine a consistent drop off and pick up plan.

School Hours and Arrival

Students in preschool through fifth grade are in class from 8:15 am to 3:15 pm on Mondays, Tuesdays, Thursdays, and Fridays. Wednesdays are early release days for all students ending at 1:15 pm to allow for staff meetings, professional development, and reflection. Students are not allowed to be inside of any building prior to 8:15 am unless they are being supervised by an adult. Elementary School students are considered tardy if they arrive at school after 8:30 am.

In order to uphold our safety protocols and respect classroom instruction, family members may walk their child to the classroom between 8:15 - 8:30 AM. After 8:30 AM, we have staff members designated to assist children with getting to their classrooms and settling in for the day. This ensures that anyone entering our school building after 8:30 AM is properly signed in using our Raptor system, per requirements outlined in the School Safety Omnibus Act of 2018.

<u>Dismissa</u>l

For dismissal, students are not permitted to remain on school grounds after 3:15 PM without adult supervision. All elementary school students should be picked up by 3:15 PM on Monday, Tuesday, Thursday, and Friday; and by 1:15 PM on Wednesdays, unless signed up for aftercare. The school has the right to contact CFSA to make a report of child neglect in the event children are regularly not picked up by 3:30 PM. Children who have not been picked up by 3:30 PM may be referred to the school resource officer. In these cases, the school has the right to contact CFSA to make a report of child neglect. There are no school staff on site to supervise students who have not been picked up and are not part of an after school activity (*Family Handbook, page 36*).

Uniforms:

As part of our commitment to creating a positive and inclusive learning environment, Two Rivers adheres to a uniform policy for all students. Wearing uniforms fosters a sense of unity and equality among our students and promotes a focus on academics and character development. Detailed information regarding the uniform requirements, including where to purchase them, can be found on *page 25 of this packet*. We kindly request your cooperation throughout the school year in ensuring that your child adheres to the uniform policy.

Uniform Sales

Two Rivers' uniform policy is intended to generate a feeling of unity, while allowing students some personal choice.

All Two Rivers students are required to wear a uniform shirt to school each day, starting on the first day of school. Uniform pricing starts at \$7 for short-sleeve Two Rivers T-shirts, which come in a variety of colors. Two Rivers will be selling uniforms at the Young campus, (820 26th Street NE, on the Green), at the following times:

Uniforms will not be sold during the first week of school; however, the online store will reopen on Tuesday, September 3, 2024.

Payments can be made in the form of cash, Apple Pay, credit card, and/or debit card.

We use these tools as part of our ongoing work to ensure every student is reaching both academic and developmental milestones, and it helps us know a bit about your child before their year starts.

You will likely want to print or review a PDF of the questionnaire on your device before submitting the answers online because some questions ask about your child's response to very specific tasks that you might not have done with your child. Please use this <u>link</u> and click the option for BOTH ASQ-3 and ASQ-SE-2 on the welcome screen. We ask that you complete these questionnaires by August 12th at the latest.

Parental Medicaid Consent Form

If your child receives special education services, please review and complete a <u>Parental Medicaid Consent Form</u> to ensure that Two Rivers can receive appropriate federal reimbursements for certain health related services provided pursuant to your child's IEP. The form can be turned in at your school's front desk. Examples of health related services for which Two Rivers may be reimbursed include the following:

Before and Aftercare Enrichment Need Based Scholarships

Currently Apollo is applying to participate in OSSE's Childcare Voucher program with Two Rivers. Meals at Two Rivers

Dear Parent/Guardian:

Children need healthy meals to learn. Two Rivers Public Charter School offers healthy meals every school day. The breakfast costs is FREE; lunch costs \$4.05. Your children may qualify for free meals or for reduced price meals. Reduced price is FREE for breakfast and FREE for lunch. This packet includes an <u>application</u> for free or reduced price meal benefits, and a set of detailed instructions. <u>Here</u> are some common questions and answers to help you with the application process. If you need help completing the actual application, please find the instructions <u>here</u>.

This year, we will continue using our meal vendor - Whitson's Culinary Group.

Who can get free OR REDUCED PRICE meals?

- All children in households receiving benefits from DC SNAP, DC TANF, are eligible for free meals.
- Foster children that are under the legal responsibility of a foster care agency or court are eligible for free meals.
- Children participating in their school's Head Start program are eligible for free meals.
- Children who meet the definition of homeless, runaway, or migrant are eligible for free meals.
- Children may receive free or reduced price meals if your household's income is within the limits
 on the Federal Income Eligibility Guidelines. Your children may qualify for free or reduced price
 meals if your household income falls at or below the limits on this chart.

Chess Club



Apollo has completed the initial inspection to begin accepting vouchers and is waiting for our school buildings to be certified. Once that is approved, Apollo will have to complete an additional application to be able to accept subsidy payments.

Subsidy approved families will not see Apollo as an option until the aforementioned steps are completed. At this time, vouchers will not be offered. We will inform families via the Trib when the voucher process is complete. If you would like for your student(s) to be considered for a scholarship, please email your Assistant Principal.

Childcare Subsidy Vouchers are for families needing after-school care, you can apply for subsidy vouchers through this <u>link</u>. This support can help cover the cost of after-school care, ensuring that your child is in a safe and nurturing environment. Flyers with more information are linked <u>here</u>.

Before and aftercare enrollment will take place on a rolling basis from now until the start of school - while we encourage families to register at their earliest ability, Apollo anticipates being able to serve all families who enroll before August 1 by staffing based upon family interest.
