Student Placement in Crews and Classrooms:

A great deal of time, effort and thought has gone into the process of student placement for the upcoming school year. Teachers, counselors, and leaders took careful consideration to ensure your student is placed in a crew where they can feel a sense of belonging, excitement for the school year, and reassurance in being a part of a crew they know and love.

Student Attendance:

At Two Rivers, we believe that every day counts. Missing even a few days of school can make it more difficult for students to stay connected, keep up with lessons, and feel confident in their learning. We understand that sometimes absences are unavoidable due to illness or emergencies. To celebrate and reinforce strong attendance habits, students with perfect attendance during Quarter 1 will be recognized and celebrated. Our goal is always to partner with families in ensuring students arrive at school on time, every day, ready to learn.

Arrival and Dismissal:

We need your partnership with timely arrival and dismissal. As you prepare for the new school year, we encourage your family to determine a consistent drop off and pick up plan.

School Hours and Arrival:

Students in preschool through fifth grade are in class from 8:15 am to 3:15 pm on Mondays, Tuesdays, Thursdays, and Fridays. Wednesdays are early release days for all students ending at 1:15 pm to allow for staff meetings, professional learning, and reflection. Students are not allowed to be inside of any building prior to 8:15 am unless they are being supervised by an adult. Elementary School students are considered tardy if they arrive at school after 8:30 am. If your child arrives after 8:30 am you will not be allowed to escort your child to class.

Dismissal:

In order to provide necessary teacher planning and preparation and conduct our after school program accordingly, Elementary school students who are not enrolled in aftercare or another club are not permitted to remain on school grounds after 3:30 pm without adult supervision. All elementary school students must be picked up by 3:15 pm, Monday, Tuesday, Thursday, and Friday, and at 1:15 pm on Wednesdays. Only students with written permission from their parents or guardian and the permission of a school administrator will be allowed to walk home or use public transportation home from school.

Early Dismissal:

All early dismissal/pick ups will stop at 2:45 pm. We will not release your child for early pickup after 2:45PM. If you miss early pickup, your child will be dismissed at 3:15 pm (regular dismissal). Parents and or guardians will not be allowed to wait in the lobby for pickup between 2:45 pm-3:15 pm.

Students will wait in the lobby until the program concludes at 9:00 am.

Community Meeting:

Every Wednesday, we will hold Community Meeting from 8:30 am to 9:00 am. This is a school-wide tradition in which families and community members are encouraged to join. To maintain safety and security, any students, families, or community members who arrive after 8:30 am. will be marked tardy and will not be permitted past the lobby. Students will wait in the lobby until the program concludes at 9:00 am.

Uniforms:

As part of our commitment to creating a positive and inclusive learning environment, Two Rivers adheres to a uniform policy for all students. Wearing uniforms fosters a sense of unity and equality among our students and promotes a focus on academics and character development. Detailed information regarding the uniform requirements, including where to purchase them, can be found in the attached document. We kindly request your cooperation throughout the school year in ensuring that your child adheres to the uniform policy.



Uniform Sales

Two Rivers' uniform policy is intended to generate a feeling of unity, while allowing students some personal choice.

All Two Rivers students are required to wear a Two Rivers branded uniform shirt each day, beginning on the first day of school. Students may wear any school-appropriate bottoms and closed-toe shoes. (Open-toe shoes are not permitted.)

Uniform shirts start at \$7 for short-sleeve t-shirts and are available in a variety of colors. Elementary school students can wear any color Two Rivers branded uniform t-shirt purchased from us.

Students are not permitted to customize their uniform t-shirts, polos, sweatshirts, or hoodies. We ask that no embellishments, decorations, or alterations be added to uniform tops.

Immunizations and Medical Records

Don't Delay, Schedule Today! In order to prevent the spread of infectious diseases, it is vital that all students are up-to-date with required immunizations. All students must have an up-to-date immunization certification on file with Two Rivers. Please note, proof of appointment will no longer be accepted. Schedule your child's doctor visits now or send forms from recent appointments ASAP - your child's pediatrician will be able to provide the forms we need. If your child has severe allergies, it is imperative that their physician completes an <u>Anaphylaxis Action Plan</u> and prescribes an epinephrine auto-injector (EpiPen). This form must be fully completed and submitted directly to the Health Suite team at your child's school location.

Permission to Administer Medication

If your child needs to take medication during the school day, please use this *form* to detail your student's medication and/or medical procedure plan to be administered at school and return it to the the school nurse or medical@tworiverspcs.org. The School Nurse will contact you to arrange medication/medical supply drop-off. For multiple needs, complete multiple sheets.

Parental Medicaid Consent Form

Students with disabilities only.

If your child receives special education services, please review and complete a <u>Parental Medicaid Consent Form</u> to ensure that Two Rivers can receive appropriate federal reimbursements for certain health related services provided pursuant to your child's IEP. 

MEALS AT TWO RIVERS



Dear Parent/Guardian:

We're looking forward to another great year with our dedicated meal vendor, Whitsons Culinary Group, who continues to provide nutritious, student-approved meals for our community.

Breakfast at Two Rivers is free for all students. For lunch, Two Rivers PCS participates in the National School Lunch Program (NSLP), which offers both free and low-cost meals. However, Two Rivers PCS is not a CEP (Community Eligibility Provision) school, which means not all students automatically qualify for free meals. Instead, families must either:

- Submit a Free and Reduced Meal Application, or
- Pay for meals directly through the <u>online store</u>

If you believe your family may qualify, please complete the <u>Free and Reduced Meal Application form</u>. If you need a paper form or have any questions about the meal program, please contact Christopher Headecker at **cheadecker@tworiverspcs.org**.


If your child has a food allergy or specific dietary need, it is important that you complete the <u>Meal Preference Form</u> to ensure they receive meals that meet their health requirements.

Who can get free OR REDUCED PRICE meals?

- Children may receive free or reduced price meals if your household's income is within the limits
 on the Federal Income Eligibility Guidelines. Your children may qualify for free or reduced price
 meals if your household income falls at or below the limits on this <u>chart</u>.
