Dear Two Rivers Middle School Families,

Welcome back to another exciting school year at Two Rivers Middle School (TRMS), home of the Sharks! As we embark on the new academic year as "one crew", I am delighted to share our priorities and the implementation of key programs that will foster a strong crew culture and provide rigorous learning experiences for all our students.

Our theme of "one crew" helps to embody our collective commitment to the shared mission of our school's success. While we honor the diversity of our staff, student, and family body, we are here as "one crew" living out the TR mission - To nurture a diverse group of students to become life-long, active participants in their own education, develop a sense of self and community, and become responsible and compassionate members of society.

At TRMS, we plan to live our mission this school year by continuing to focus on:

- 1. Creating a culture of achievement and academic challenge for a diverse group of learners.
- 2. Fostering a positive "sense of self and community" through strong crew programs and student leadership opportunities.
- **3.** Engaging students in high-quality work and showcasing their accomplishments to the school community so that they are "active participants in their own learning."

What We Learned from 2024–2025

Last school year, our students made significant academic and cultural gains. In seventh grade ELA, 76 percent of students met their MAP growth goal, and in eighth grade math, 68 percent of students met their growth goal. We also saw our strongest culture to date, where students reported feeling more supported and connected to adults at school, and our major behavior incidents decreased by over 85 percent. This growth reflects our collective commitment to crew, restorative practices, and our renewed focus on high-quality instruction.

Our Focus for 2025-2026

This year, we are focused on increasing the instructional demands of every classroom. This means every student will experience high-quality learning that is rigorous, joyful, and aligned to real-world expectations. To accomplish this, we have made key changes to our schedule, intervention systems, and core curriculum.

Culture of Achievement - What to expect from your child's learning experience...

At our school, we are committed to fostering a culture of achievement for all learners. Here's what you can expect:

New Daily Schedule - Our new school day begins promptly at 8:30 am. Students may arrive as early as 8:00 am and participate in Study Hall, a quiet and supervised space to complete assignments or prepare for the day. Students arriving after 8:30 am are considered late. We have moved away from a block schedule, and students will now engage in all four core content areas — Math, ELA, Science, and Social Studies — every day. This change allows for stronger routines, more targeted feedback, and consistent practice with essential skills.

Differentiated Learning (New Intervention and Enrichment Labs) - Every student will participate in a daily, data-driven Lab course, designed to meet their individual academic needs. Lab placements are based on MAP data, classroom performance, and teacher input, and are updated throughout the year. Students may receive support in foundational skills or be challenged through enrichment. Labs take place Monday, Tuesday, Thursday, and Friday, with a workshop-based model on Wednesdays.

Curriculum Enhancements - We are excited to implement rigorous, discussion-based programs across all core content areas:

- ELA EL Education Modules
- Math Illustrative Math with iReady for personalized practice
- Science Amplify Science
- **Social Studies** TCI History Alive!

These programs are designed to support deep thinking, real-world connections, and collaborative learning. We will continue offering accelerated math coursework beginning in seventh grade, with Algebra I available for eighth graders who meet promotion requirements. Eighth-grade students will also take the PSAT in March to support early college and career awareness.

Additional Enrichment Opportunities - All students will continue to benefit from a well-rounded education including:

- Spanish for all grade levels
- Health and Physical Education
- *Arts electives, including African Drumming
- **Wednesday Clubs based on student interest
- After-school athletics:
 - 1. Fall: co-ed soccer, volleyball, flag football, cross country
 - 2. Winter: basketball (girls/boys), chess, cheerleading, archery (tentative)
 - 3. Spring: track & field, co-ed soccer, flag football, baseball (tentative)

**Arts Electives - Students in 7th and 8th grade will take one elective per semester, and have an opportunity to elect their top 4 arts elective using the provided Arts Elective form by Monday, August 11, 2025.

**Wednesday Clubs - All 6th-8th graders can explore a variety of club options this year. Please help your child rank their top three club choices using the provided Wednesday Clubs form by Monday, August 11, 2025.

<u>Culture of Crew</u> - Building a positive sense of self and community for your child...

Each day begins with Crew promptly at 8:30 am. Crew is a structured space for students to build community, reflect on academic and behavior data, and set personal goals. Crew is a graded course and required for students to pass each year at the middle school. To monitor their academic and social progress, students will maintain a data book and portfolio that they present to families during student-led conferences. This process not only prepares students for these conferences but also equips them to successfully defend their 8th-grade passage portfolio, a significant academic milestone and promotion requirement. We ask for your support in ensuring your child arrives on time for Crew each day at 8:30 am, as it is crucial for their success in our academic program.

Middle School Social Calendar - We are excited to offer a Middle School Social Calendar, offering at least two social events each quarter and weekly community meetings. Additionally, students can earn quarterly dress-down days and Fun Fridays (4 times/year) by meeting their Crew's "Caught in the Acts" (CIA) goals. These activities aim to build community and provide positive, engaging experiences for our students.

Behavior Management Structures - Our behavior management approach combines restorative practices, positive interventions, and logical consequences. We will continue to use "red sheets" for minor incidents like tardiness, inappropriate language, cell phone misuse, and uniform violations. These sheets serve as reflective tools for students and are shared with families. For major incidents, we follow our code of conduct outlined in the family handbook. We also celebrate positive behaviors through our "Caught in the Acts" (CIAs) system, aligned with our scholarly habits. This balanced approach helped reduce negative behaviors by over 85% last year, and we aim to maintain this momentum this year.

High Quality Work and Celebrations of Learning - Empowering your child to lead their own learning...

Through our Expeditionary Learning model, students are "connected to the world beyond school through meaningful fieldwork, collaboration with professional experts and service learning." You can expect your student to attend off-campus field experiences for each subject area, work with professional experts to deepen their understanding, and create high-quality projects/products connected to meaningful questions. These experiences will be showcased in our Celebrations of Learning held twice a year and other student showcases, such as our annual Student Film Festival and STEM Fair. Additionally, all eighth-grade students will complete and defend a final passage portfolio, and students in every grade will participate in student-led conferences each quarter.

Student Arrival & Dismissal

Arrival

To ensure a smooth start to the school day, please help your child arrive on time. School doors will open at 8:20 am, with Crew starting at 8:30 am. Students are considered late at 8:30 am. Students are not allowed inside the main building before 8:20 am unless supervised or enrolled in our before-care program, Apollo. If students arrive early (between 8:00 am and 8:20 am), they should go to the gym through the side gate, where they can participate in study hall until the school doors open. If students arrive before 8:00am, they must enroll in our before care program, Apollo.

Dismissal

At the middle school, instruction ends at 3:30 pm on Monday, Tuesday, Thursday, and Friday, and at 1:30 pm on Wednesdays for staff development. Dismissal will occur in waves, with students released according to the following schedule:

Students are expected to remain on campus and in class until their designated dismissal time, as early departures limit access to essential instructional minutes. Early dismissal ends at 2:30 pm, students will not be dismissed early after this time. Once dismissed, students may not return to campus unless accompanied by a staff member or adult. Students who walk home independently must have written permission from a parent or guardian and school approval. After-school care and extracurricular programming are offered through Apollo. In addition to Apollo, TRMS will offer middle school athletics and extracurricular clubs. More details will be shared in our September newsletter.

Uniform Sales

Two Rivers' uniform policy is intended to generate a feeling of unity, while allowing students some personal choice.

All Two Rivers students are required to wear a *Two Rivers branded uniform shirt* each day, beginning on the **first day of school**. Students may wear **any school-appropriate bottoms and closed-toe shoes**. (Opentoe shoes are not permitted.)

Uniform shirts start at \$7 for short-sleeve t-shirts and are available in a variety of colors. Students **are not permitted** to customize their uniform t-shirts, polos, sweatshirts, or hoodies. We ask that no embellishments, decorations, or alterations be added to uniform tops.

SCHOOLWIDE ALLERGEN ALERT

Greetings Two Rivers Middle School Families,

As we prepare for the excitement of a new school year, we wanted to make you aware of important information regarding food items which will not be allowed, due to student and staff's severe allergies. If the child or adult accidentally ingests these foods, they will swiftly enter life-threatening anaphylaxis. Per our family handbook, "we will do what is medically required for students with food allergies, up to and including banning specific foods from classrooms."

The following food items will not be permitted at the Middle School:

- Peanuts (including any foods containing peanuts, like granola bars or candy)
- Sesame (including any foods containing sesame, such as hummus and seaweed snacks)
- Cashews
- Pistachios

In addition to ensuring your child does not bring the above food items to school, we ask that you also help reinforce that we do not share food at school. This helps us prevent any possible allergic reactions that may arise in the event a child accidentally ingests an allergen. Two exceptions to the no-sharing policy include potlucks and birthday celebrations. Please ensure any food items brought in for a potluck do not contain the above allergens. If you wish to bring a treat for your child's birthday, please ensure there is enough for everyone in the class.

Children suffering from food allergies are too often bullied by peers, who sometimes do not take their condition seriously. To learn more, and find resources about how to talk to your child about food allergy bullying, visit https://www.foodallergy.org/resources/bullying-prevention.

Immunizations and Medical Records

Don't Delay, Schedule Today! In order to prevent the spread of infectious diseases, it is vital that all students are up-to-date with required immunizations. All students must have an up-to-date immunization certification on file with Two Rivers. Please note, proof of appointment will no longer be accepted. Schedule your child's doctor visits now or send forms from recent appointments ASAP - your child's pediatrician will be able to provide the forms we need. Permission to Administer Medication

If your child has severe allergies, it is imperative that their physician completes an <u>Anaphylaxis Action Plan</u> and prescribes an epinephrine auto-injector (EpiPen). This form must be fully completed and submitted directly to the Health Suite team at your child's school location.

Permission to Administer Medication

If your child needs to take medication during the school day, please use this *form* to detail your student's medication and/or medical procedure plan to be administered at school and return it to the the school nurse or medical@tworiverspcs.org. The School Nurse will contact you to arrange medication/medical supply drop-off. For multiple needs, complete multiple sheets.

Parental Medicaid Consent Form

Students with disabilities only.

If your child receives special education services, please review and complete a <u>Parental Medicaid Consent Form</u> to ensure that Two Rivers can receive appropriate federal reimbursements for certain health related services provided pursuant to your child's IEP. The form can be turned in at your school's front desk. Examples of health related services for which Two Rivers may be reimbursed include the following:

- Audiology Services/Assessment
- Behavioral Support Services
- Occupational Therapy/Assessment
- Speech-Language Pathology Services/Assessment
- Mobility Assessment
- Physical Therapy Services Assessment
- Psychological Evaluation
- Special Education Transportation Services

MEALS AT TWO RIVERS

Meals at Two Rivers

Dear Parent/Guardian:

We're looking forward to another great year with our dedicated meal vendor, Whitsons Culinary Group, who continues to provide nutritious, student-approved meals for our community.

Breakfast at Two Rivers is free for all students. For lunch, Two Rivers PCS participates in the National School Lunch Program (NSLP), which offers both free and low-cost meals. However, Two Rivers PCS is not a CEP (Community Eligibility Provision) school, which means not all students automatically qualify for free meals. Instead, families must either:

- Submit a Free and Reduced Meal Application, or
- Pay for meals directly through the <u>online store</u>

If you believe your family may qualify, please complete the <u>Free and Reduced Meal Application form</u>. If you need a paper form or have any questions about the meal program, please contact Christopher Headecker at **cheadecker@tworiverspcs.org**.

If your child has a food allergy or specific dietary need, it is important that you complete the <u>Meal</u> <u>Preference Form</u> to ensure they receive meals that meet their health requirements.

Who can get free OR REDUCED PRICE meals?

- All children in households receiving benefits from DC SNAP, DC TANF, are eligible for free meals.
- Foster children that are under the legal responsibility of a foster care agency or court are eligible for free meals.
- Children participating in their school's Head Start program are eligible for free meals.
- Children who meet the definition of homeless, runaway, or migrant are eligible for free meals.
- o Children may receive free or reduced price meals if your household's income is within the limits on the Federal Income Eligibility Guidelines. Your children may qualify for free or reduced price meals if your household income falls at or below the limits on this <u>chart</u>.

YONDR PROGRAM

August 2025

Dear Middle School Families,

As we enter our third year as a phone-free campus, we remain deeply committed to creating a focused, engaged, and respectful learning environment. Our partnership with Yondr has proven to be a valuable part of this commitment, and we're excited to continue this work with your support.

What's Staying the Same:

All middle school students are required to secure their phones and smartwatches in their individual Yondr pouches upon arrival at school. These will remain locked during the entire school day. Students will unlock their pouches at dismissal before exiting the building.

- All students must purchase a Yondr pouch through the school for \$30. Pouches are reusable each year, provided they remain in working condition. Families needing financial assistance should reach out to our homeless liaison, Mr. Johnathan Weech or Front Desk Associate, Ms. Renata Medford for support.
- Students without a purchased pouch will be required to turn in their phone to school staff before entering the building each morning.
- If you need to reach your child during the school day, please call our main office at 202-388-3177.

Cell Phone Violations:

If a student is caught with their phone during the school day (including if they attempt to bypass Yondr or do not secure it properly):

- The phone will be confiscated immediately and must be picked up by a parent/guardian from the Principal.
- The student will be placed on a Phone Plan and assigned 2 days of after-school detention.
- Repeated violations may result in further disciplinary action, as outlined in our school-wide behavior response ladder.

YONDR PROGRAM

August 2025

Daily Procedure:

To ensure a consistent, safe, and distraction-free environment, all students are expected to follow the daily Yondr procedures every morning upon arrival. This process helps us maintain a focused learning

space and ensures all devices are secured for the school day.

• Phones must be powered off and placed in the Yondr pouch in front of staff upon arrival.

• Students are required to store the pouch in their locker.

• Students who do not purchase a Yondr pouch will be required to turn in their phone to

their assigned Grade-Level Bin upon entering the building each morning. Phones will be

returned at dismissal.

Students arriving late or leaving early must pouch/unpouch in the main office.

Frequently Asked Questions

What if I want to reach my child during the school day?

We want our students to be engaged in their learning. If you need to contact your child during the school day, contact the main office at 202-388-3177.

What if there is a school emergency?

In case of a school emergency, we direct our students to safety first, following our school emergency preparedness protocol.

Will my student's phone be safe?

Students will be advised to turn their phone - in their Yondr pouch - with their crew leader or place it in their locker for the entire school day. This will reduce their chances of it being lost or stolen.

What if the Yondr pouch gets damaged or a student is caught on their phone? If a student damages their Pouch or is caught on their phone, the school will collect the

If a student damages their Pouch or is caught on their phone, the school will collect the phone/Pouch and contact the family. Please see the Phone Policy and Guidelines on page 21.

Note: Damage consists of any signs that the physical integrity of the pouch has been compromised, whether intentional or unintentional, as determined by the school or Yondr staff.

STUDENT PHONE POLICY & GUIDELINES

Phones are not to be used during school. Every middle school student that owns a phone must purchase a personal Pouch through the school store for \$30. It is each student's responsibility to bring their Pouch with them to school every day and keep it in good working condition. Students can use the same pouch each year, considering it is in working condition. The campus homeless liaison and Business Manager will work together to support families unable to pay the \$30.

DAILY PROCESS

As students Arrive to School, they will:

- 1. Turn their phone off.
- 2. Place their phone inside their Pouch and secure it in front of the designated school staff (school admin)
- 3. Store their Pouch with their crew leader or in their locker for the day.
- 4. If students do not have their Yondr pouch, their phone will be collected for the day by our Dean.

At the end of the day, students will open their Pouch, remove their phone and have the option to either put their Pouch in their crew bin at grade level exit or take the Pouch home. Families must indicate if a child has a phone on the BOY Survey.

*Students arriving late or leaving early will pouch/unpouch their phones in the Main Office

VIOLATIONS:

Pouch Damage / Lost Pouch / Using Phone During School If a student damages their Pouch or is caught on their phone, Administration will collect the phone/Pouch and call home for a **Parent Pickup** and **Progressive Discipline** which is based on our middle school behavior response ladder (1st offense, 2nd offense, 3rd offense). Damaged Yondr pouches will cost \$30 to replace.

Examples of damage:



- Deep scratches on the globe and on the green ring around it
- Intentional pen marks on the inside of the Pouch
- Bent pins
- Pin and button not fully recessing, due to pin damage

Forgotten Pouch

If a student forgets to put their phone in their Pouch, their phone will be collected and Admin will call home to remind the Parent of the policy. The phone will be returned to the student at dismissal and a cellphone plan will be reviewed with the student/parent and issued to the student.

If a student consistently forgets their Pouch, it is considered Lost. Refer to the Lost Pouch policy above.

CURRICULUM OVERVIEW

Dear TRMS Families,

As we kick off the 2025–2026 school year, we want to share an overview of the core academic curricula we use at TRMS. Each program is designed to support student growth through inquiry, discussion, problem-solving, and real-world application. Below is a breakdown of what each curriculum is and how the learning is structured throughout the year.

English Language Arts – EL Education Modules

R Education

What It Is: EL Education is a comprehensive literacy curriculum that combines the study of powerful texts with writing, vocabulary, and deep thinking. Students explore meaningful topics such as identity, perseverance, and community through high-interest novels, articles, and multimedia. Lessons are designed to support critical reading, academic conversation, and evidence-based writing.

Structure:

- Students complete 4 modules per year
- Each module is built around an essential question and includes multiple texts and a culminating performance task
- Reading, writing, speaking, and listening are integrated daily

Math - Illustrative Mathematics (IM)



What It Is: Our math instruction is anchored in Illustrative Mathematics, a problem-based curriculum that builds deep understanding of math concepts through visual models, real-world scenarios, and student discussion. This year, we are also incorporating iReady, an adaptive digital platform that provides personalized practice based on each student's individual strengths and areas of growth.

Together, these tools allow students to build fluency, flexibility, and confidence in math. IM guides whole-group learning through rich tasks and collaboration, while iReady offers targeted support and enrichment at each student's level.

Structure:

- Students complete 8–9 units across the year
- Each unit builds upon the previous one and includes lessons, practice, and checks for understanding
- Emphasizes reasoning, discussion, and representation over simply "getting the answer."

Science - Amplify Science

Amplify Science

What It Is: Amplify Science is a hands-on, inquiry-based science curriculum that invites students to think and work like scientists and engineers. Every unit is centered around a compelling real-world problem or phenomenon that students investigate over time. Amplify blends hands-on experiments, interactive digital tools, nonfiction texts, and scientific writing.

Structure:

- Students complete 3–4 units per year
- Each unit includes a central question or problem that students investigate through experimentation, modeling, and data collection
- Emphasizes argumentation, evidence-based thinking, and scientific collaboration

Social Studies - TCI: History Alive!



What It Is: TCI is an engaging, student-centered Social Studies curriculum that brings history and civics to life through simulations, primary source analysis, and interactive storytelling. Students are active participants in their learning—whether role-playing ancient civilizations, examining artifacts, or debating historical decisions. The curriculum emphasizes both content knowledge and critical thinking.

Structure:

- Students study 7–9 units across the school year
- Content includes geography, early civilizations, U.S. history, and government depending on grade level
- Each lesson includes reading, interactive activities, and opportunities for reflection and discussion

These curricula reflect our commitment to providing all students with engaging, high-quality instruction that promotes deep understanding and lifelong learning skills. We are excited for a strong school year ahead and look forward to seeing your children grow and thrive.

INTRO TO LAB

Dear Two Rivers Middle School Families,

We're excited to share one of the most important additions to our academic program this year our expanded Intervention & Enrichment Lab model. Starting in the 2025–2026 school year, all TRMS students will participate in daily, data-driven Lab classes, designed to meet their individual academic needs in a focused, engaging, and empowering way.

What Is Lab?

Lab is a dedicated, daily block of instruction that provides targeted support or enrichment in ELA or Math. Whether your student needs foundational skill building or is ready to be challenged through enrichment, every child will receive instruction aligned to their current academic needs.

Students are grouped based on their data and work in smaller, intentional classes led by our content-area, special education, and special teachers. Labs are 40 minutes long and occur Monday, Tuesday, Thursday, and Friday. On Wednesdays, students continue Lab through a smaller, workshop-based structure tied to their growth areas.

How Are Students Placed?

Students are placed in Lab groups using assessment data like the NWEA MAP test (taken in September, January, and May), classroom performance, and teacher input. Lab placements are reviewed throughout the year to make sure students are in the group that best supports their learning.

Why We're Excited

Lab is a powerful tool to help us meet students where they are. Whether your child needs extra support, is ready for enrichment, or somewhere in between Lab ensures they're growing in the ways that matter most. We can't wait to launch this exciting addition to our program and watch your child thrive.

- Intervention & Enrichment Labs, newly added to our daily schedule to support personalized learning.
